- 1) What kind of family of origin did Jephthah have?
- 2) What do we learn about the fact that God still uses Jephthah despite him not being a conventional choice for leadership?
- 3) Why do you think Jephthah makes his vow in verses 30-31?
- 4) Should Christians make promises to God? Have you ever done that?
- 5) Why do you think Jephthah feels he must go through with fulfilling his vow? What can we learn from this?

Going Deeper

- 6) What are some modern-day examples of syncretism, that as Christians we should be aware of?
- 7) How does Jephthah's story ultimately point us to Jesus Christ?
